- Fuel level. Fill the fuel tank when necessary (pages 82-85).
 Check for leaks.
- 3. **Brakes.** Check operation. Make sure there is no brake fluid leakage. If necessary, adjust free play (pages 111-121).
- 4. Tires. Check condition and pressure (pages 123-125).
- 5. **Throttle.** Check for smooth opening and closing in all steering positions.
- 6. Headlight and headlight dimmer switches. Check for proper function (page 18).
- 7. Engine stop switch. Check for proper function (page 14).
- 8. Nuts, bolts, fasteners. Check the wheels to see that the axle nuts are tightened. Check the security of all other nuts, bolts and fasteners.
- Steering. Check that the wheels turn properly as you steer the handlebars.
- 10. Rear trunk. Check that all cargo is properly secured.
- 11. Underbody and exhaust system. Check for, and remove, any dirt, vegetation or other debris that could be a fire hazard or interfere with the proper operation of the vehicle.
- 12. **Drive chain.** Check condition and slack. If necessary adjust and lubricate (pages 100-103).

AWARNING

POTENTIAL HAZARD

Failure to inspect the ATV before operating. Failure to properly maintain the ATV.
