Periodic Checks

You should also perform other periodic maintenance checks at least once a month regardless of how often you ride, or more often if you ride frequently.

Also, check the odometer reading against the Maintenance Schedule and perform all maintenance that is due. ▶ P. 37

Tires and wheels	Check the air pressure (►) P. 50), examine tread for wear and damage (►) P. 51), and check the wheels for damage.
Fluid levels	Check the engine oil level (♠ P. 59), engine coolant level (♠ P. 66), clutch fluid level (♠ P. 75), and brake fluid level (♠ P. 68).
Lights	Check that the headlight, brake light, taillight, turn signals and license plate light are working properly.
Controls	Check the freeplay of the throttle grip (♠ P. 76). Check the clutch lever (♠ P. 77), front brake lever (♠ P. 77) and rear brake pedal.
Drive chain	Check the slack (♠ P. 72), adjust the slack (♠ P. 73), and lubricate (♠ P. 48) as needed.
Fuses	Check that you have a full supply of spare fuses.
Nuts & bolts	Check the major nuts and bolts, and tighten as needed.
