Tires and wheels	Check the air pressure ( $\blacktriangleright$ P. 75), examine tread for wear and damage ( $\triangleright$ P. 75), and check the wheels for damage.	
Fluid levels	Check the engine oil level (⊉ P. 83), engine coolant level (⊉ P. 87), and brake fluid level (⊉ P. 89).	
Lights	Check that the headlights, position lights, brake light, taillight, turn signals and license plate light are working properly.	
Controls	Check the freeplay of the clutch lever (⊇ P. 97) and throttle grip (⊇ P. 100). Check the front brake lever (⊇ P. 102) and rear brake pedal operate properly.	
Drive chain	Check the slack ( $\blacksquare$ P. 93), adjust the slack ( $\blacksquare$ P. 94), and lubricate ( $\blacksquare$ P. 74) as needed.	
Fuses	Check that you have a full supply of spare fuses.	
Nuts & bolts	Check the major nuts and bolts, and tighten as needed.
