Starting & Stopping the Engine

- 3. Warm up the engine by opening and closing the throttle slightly.
- 4. After the engine has warmed up, push the choke lever down all the way to fully OFF (B).
- 5. If idling is unstable, open the throttle slightly.

High Air Temperature 35°C (95°F) or above

- 1. Do not use the choke.
- 2. With the throttle closed, start the engine.

Low Air Temperature 10°C (50°F) or below

- 1. Pull the choke lever (1) up all the way to fully ON (A) if the engine is cold.
- 2. With the throttle 1/8 1/4 open, start the engine.
- 3. Warm up the engine by opening and closing the throttle slightly.
- 4. Continue warming up the engine until it runs smoothly and responds to the throttle, when the choke lever down all the way to fully OFF.
- 5. If idling is unstable, open the throttle slightly.

NOTICE

Extended use of the choke may impair piston and cylinder wall lubrication and shorten the life of the engine.
